<b>Application:</b>			<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Practice tying the knots – they can also be tied as a contest for speed – but check that the knots are tied correctly</li> <li>2. Practice setting up troop tents and tarps</li> <li>3. Practice adjusting backpacks for load and size of participants</li> </ol>
<b>Evaluation:</b>			<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Check that the knots are properly tied and everyone knows <u>when</u> and <u>why</u> to use them</li> </ol>
<b>Summary:</b>			Just as the right tool makes a job easier – the right gear makes camping more fun!
